

Removal of Stock System

- 1. Apply penetrating lubricant liberally to all exhaust fasteners, hangers and rubber insulators. Lower the spare tire and remove the heat shield. **Refer to Figure 1.**
- **2.** Remove the two nuts securing the factory driver-side tail pipe and remove the driver-side tailpipe.

3. Remove the clamp after the catalytic converter and save the clamp for the installation.


4. Remove the hangers from the rubber insulators and remove the exhaust from the vehicle. The rear suspension will need to be relaxed to allow the factory exhaust to be removed without cutting it. You may need to remove the rear passenger-side lower shock bolt to allow the suspension to droop enough. Support the axle before removing the shock bolt. Work safely.

Installation of MBRP Performance Exhaust

1. Using the factory clamp removed in Step 3, loosely attach the **Front Pipe** onto the catalytic converter and into the rubber insulator.

Refer to Figure 4.

2. Determine the length of the Extension Pipe and cut to length. Refer to Figure 5 (below).

- **3.** Using a **3"** Clamp, loosely install the Extension Pipe. Refer to Figure 6.
- **4.** Using a **3"** Clamp, loosely install the **Muffler** onto the **Extension Pipe**.

- 5. Using a 2.5" Clamp, loosely install the Passenger-Side Over-Axle Pipe into the Muffler and into the factory insulator. Refer to Figure 7.
- **6.** Using a **2.5**" Clamp, loosely install the **Driver-Side Over-Axle Pipe** into the **Muffler** and into the factory insulator. **Refer to Figure 8.**
- 7. Using a 2.5" Clamp, loosely install the **Driver-Side Rear Over-Axle Pipe** into the **Driver-Side Over-Axle Pipe**. Orient the 2.5" Clamp with the bolt on top, nut facing forward, so it will not interfere with the heat shield once reinstalled.

Refer to Figure 9.

- **8.** Place the **Driver-Side Tail Pipe** into the factory exhaust bezel and factory rubber isolator. Using a **2.5**" Clamp, loosely install the **Driver-Side Tail Pipe** onto the **Driver-Side Rear Over-Axle Pipe**.
- 9. Place the Passenger-Side Tail Pipe into the factory exhaust bezel and factory rubber isolator. Loosely install the Passenger-Side Tail Pipe onto the Passenger-Side Over-Axle Pipe using a 2.5" Clamp. You may need to remove the factory rubber insulator to clear the pipe joint. Refer to Figure 10.
- **10.** Re-install the heat shield and raise the spare tire into position.
- 11. Ensure the **Front Pipe Hanger** is level where it passes through the rubber insulator. Align the edge of each band clamp with the edge of the joint it is connecting. Tighten all hardware and clamps, starting at the front and working rearward to secure the system. Check along the full length of the exhaust system to ensure there is adequate clearance for fuel lines, vent lines, brake lines, frame, bodywork, suspension, and any wiring, etc. If there is any interference detected, relocate, or adjust to provide adequate clearance. Ensure all clamp connections are secure and components are unable to rotate or slide. Band clamps require approximately 45 lb-ft (60 N-m) of torque. Verify clearances, system security and band clamp torque after 30-60 miles (50-100 km) of driving.
